October 21, 2014 MEETING (Newark, NJ)**

Subj: Asia-Pacific Chapter Report

1. Status of the Chapter

- a. Membership - Currently there are 30 members of the chapter.
- b. Finances - According to our records, we have a minimum of \$1290 available for chapter use. All of our funds are held by national AIG. The chapter is a division of AIG, not a separate corporation.
- c. Training Held in 2014
 - (1) The chapter hosted a luncheon training event at the Hale Ikena, Fort Shafter, Hawaii on March 31, 2014 on Investment Fraud in Hawaii. Trainers were Amy Hudson, senior enforcement attorney and Leolyn Anderson, supervising investigator, both with Hawaii's Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs. Attendees earned 1 CPE at the completion of the training.
 - (2) The chapter held a day-long Procurement Fraud Training Symposium at the Hale Ikena, Fort Shafter, Hawaii on October 1, 2014. Instructor was Thomas Caulfield, AIG Executive Board member and Executive Director, Training Institutes, President's Council of IGs on Integrity and Efficiency (CIGIE). Attendees earned 8 CPEs at the completion of the symposium.
- d. Planned Training for 2015 - The chapter plans a spring event, most likely a luncheon training.

2. Chapter Support from National

- a. Chapter Webpage on the AIG Website - No issues at this time. We are working on posting all our chapter minutes on our page of the AIG website.

- b. Membership Payments - Received membership report from AIG Executive Director dated September 1, 2014. We received several membership lists throughout September in preparation for our training symposium. We questioned the accuracy of these lists and are working with AIG Executive Director and staff to resolve.
- c. CPE Credits for Training - Normally national AIG provides CPE certifiates to attendees within 30 days of chapter training. We expect issuance of CPE certificates for our October 1, 2014 training symposium on/about November 1st.
- d. Finances - Chapter President or members submit vouchers to the national AIG Treasurer for reimbursement and are usually reimbursed within 30 days for documented chapter expenses. If the expense is significant, AIG issues a check directly to the vendor. The chapter received a \$2000 grant to help with costs of the October 1, 2014 Procurement Fraud Training Symposium which mostly was used to cover Thomas Caulfield's travel expenses.

3. Additional Information

- a. Grants - \$2000 grant received for 2014.
- b. Other Meetings Held - The Board of Directors of the chapter met on May 29, 2014.
- c. New chapter officers were elected as follows: President - Steve Croley; Vice-President - Vincent Moore; and Secretary/Treasurer - Jana Dove. The new officers begin their 2 year term starting January 1, 2015.
