Steven A. Pasichow is the Deputy Inspector General/Director of Investigations for The Port Authority of New York & New Jersey. Mr. Pasichow is responsible for managing corruption and fraud investigations pertaining to Port Authority Commissioners, employees, including the Police Department, and those doing business with the Port Authority. He also manages the Fraud Prevention Program for the large capital construction projects at the Port Authority, for example, the World Trade Center site, new Goethals Bridge, the Bayonne Bridge Navigational Clearance Program, the new LaGuardia Airport Central Terminal Project and others.

Mr. Pasichow began working at the Port Authority thirteen years ago after spending more than twenty-six years with the New York City Department of Investigation (DOI), serving as Assistant Commissioner for his last thirteen years.

Mr. Pasichow was first appointed an Inspector General in 1986 for the New York City Department of General Services, where he began his career as an investigator in 1978. In 1988, he became the Inspector General for the New York City Human Resources Administration, the agency responsible for providing social services, including Public Assistance, Food Stamps, Medicaid, and various services for children (child abuse investigations, foster care, and adoption), the homeless, and senior citizens. In 1991, as the result of a fiscal crisis, some Inspector General offices were consolidated. Consequently, Mr. Pasichow assumed responsibility for additional agencies, including the Departments of Employment; Cultural Affairs; and Youth and Community Development. In 1995, he was appointed as the Inspector General for the New York City Housing Authority, while continuing to serve as an Assistant Commissioner for DOI, and supervising other IGs.

In addition, Mr. Pasichow was responsible for overseeing the Training and Peace Officer Programs at DOI, as well as coordinating the drafting, editing, and updating of DOI's Investigative Policies and Procedures Manual. Mr. Pasichow managed the Integrity Monitorship Program (otherwise known as Independent Private Sector Inspectors General "IPSIGS") for DOI, and was responsible for managing the Integrity Monitors that monitored the debris cleanup at Ground Zero following the 9/11 terrorist attacks.

Mr. Pasichow is currently a Board Member and Executive Committee member of the Association of Inspectors General (AIG) and the President of the New York/New Jersey Chapter of the AIG.

Mr. Pasichow received his Masters of Public Administration from Farleigh Dickinson University and his Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice from John Jay College of Criminal Justice. In 1989, he was a recipient of John Jay College's Distinguished Alumnus Award. Mr. Pasichow is also a Certified Fraud Examiner and Certified Inspector General.


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
