


Natalie S. Monroe

I am the First Assistant Inspector General for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and I am committed to the mission and work of the Association of Inspectors General (AIG). I currently serve on the AIG's Board of Directors, the Executive Committee and the Conference Committee. Last year, I was elected the Third Vice President and I also served on the search committee to hire the AIG's new Executive Director. Furthermore, I took a lead role in planning the 2016 national AIG conference, which took place in Boston in November 2016.


Before being named First Assistant Inspector General in September 2012, I served as the Chief of the Criminal Appeals Division at the Attorney General's Office. In that capacity, I worked on numerous criminal appeals, prosecutions and investigations involving government theft, fraud and abuse. I also regularly represented the Commonwealth in state and federal court, including responding to petitions for writ of certiorari filed in the United States Supreme Court challenging Massachusetts criminal convictions. Outside of the courtroom, I helped develop policies, procedures and legislation to strengthen and protect Massachusetts' criminal justice system. I also served as an Administrative Magistrate for the Commonwealth's Division of Administrative Law Appeals. In that role, I presided over adjudicatory hearings challenging actions taken by other state agencies and wrote numerous decisions interpreting state statutes and regulations. Prior to entering public service, I was a partner at Sullivan & Worcester LLP in Boston, where I handled complex civil litigation and investigations, including cases involving fraud, theft and embezzlement.

During my career, I have held many leadership roles in professional and volunteer organizations. Currently, for example, I am on the Editorial Board of the *Massachusetts Law Review*. I also serve on the Advisory Board to the Comptroller for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and on the Governance Advisory Board for Mass.gov, the state's website. I am a past president of the League of Women Voters of Milton (my hometown), and a past Board member for the League of Women Voters of Massachusetts. I was also selected to serve on the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court's Study Group on Eyewitness Evidence, which made comprehensive recommendations concerning the use of eyewitness evidence in criminal trials in Massachusetts.

The Massachusetts Inspector General's Office was the first state-level inspector general's office in the country and members of our office were among those who founded AIG. I am proud to be a part of Massachusetts' long-standing involvement in the national community of inspectors general.
