

**Eric W. Miller**  
**Chief Inspector General**  
**State of Florida**

Eric Miller currently serves as the Chief Inspector General for Governor Rick Scott. In this role, Miller serves as the inspector general for the Executive Office of the Governor and provides direction and guidance to the inspectors general posted in the state agencies reporting directly to Governor Scott. Before assuming his duties as Chief Inspector General, Miller had a diverse government career, including service as the inspector general for the Agency for Health Care Administration and serving as the Chief Compliance Manager for the State's legislatively-created insurance company, Citizens Property Insurance Corporation.


Miller entered public service in 1982 as a uniformed police officer for the City of Pensacola, Florida. In his years with the City of Pensacola, Miller served in roles including uniformed police officer, motorcycle officer, TAC Unit officer, Major Crimes Control Division Investigator, drug enforcement detective, police field trainer, and academy instructor. In 1993, Miller entered state service as a lieutenant with the Office of the Inspector General for the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, eventually commanding that same unit. As the Chief of Investigations for DEP's Office of Inspector General, Miller directed and coordinated investigations into governmental corruption, official misconduct, and financial crimes, investigating both criminal and administrative violations. In this role, Miller participated in and led investigations into criminal misconduct by several Florida Marine Patrol Officers, culminating in Miller's appointment to a leadership role in the Florida Marine Patrol as its assistant director.

In 2001, Miller assumed a leadership role at the Department of Insurance, directing the operations of the Bureau of Fire and Arson Investigations for the Division of the State Fire Marshal. In 2004, Miller was asked by Florida's first Chief Financial Officer to serve as the Director of the Division of Insurance Fraud, the criminal justice agency responsible for the investigation of insurance fraud, title fraud, insurance related crimes, and other financial crimes in the State of Florida. Miller served in that role until 2007 when he was tapped to lead the Divisions of State Fire Marshal, Insurance Fraud, and Worker Compensation as the Deputy Chief Financial Officer for Compliance and Enforcement.

Miller has been awarded the Bronze Cross for Meritorious Police Service, and as a young officer was named Outstanding Young Law Enforcement Officer of the Year for Escambia County. Miller has taught at four police academies in Florida, served as a guest lecturer at Florida State University, and participated in the drafting of a whitepaper on government retrenchment at the invitation of Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government.


Miller possesses a bachelor's degree in *Criminal Justice* and master's degree in *Public Administration*. He is a certified financial crimes investigator and a certified inspector general. Miller resides in Tallahassee with his wife, the former Gina Grant, and their two sons, Andrew and Aiden.
