My current full-time position is an Assistant Professor of Public Policy, in the Department of Public Management at John Jay College of Criminal Justice. I regularly teach in the Master of Public Administration in Inspection and Oversight program. I have been an instructor with the Association of Inspectors General (the "Association") Institutes for more than a decade. During this time, I have taught twice a year in the Certified Inspector General and Certified Inspector General Investigator Institute. It has been an honor to regularly present on cyber-related topics relevant to the inspection and oversight community at the annual Association training conference. In addition, I regularly lecture at and consult with inspector general offices from all over the nation on matters of cyber investigations.

I have over two decades of experience developing custom investigative, forensic, and data management solutions for federal, state and local government agencies. I have developed cutting edge software used by federal law enforcement to combat public corruption, money laundering, and other federal crimes.

As an academic, my primary research and consulting interests include technology law and policy, information security, investigative operations and technology, open-source investigations, cryptocurrency, dark-net markets, big data, and UCR crime data. I have worked on sponsored research for, or in partnership with, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the United States Department of Justice, the United States Bureau of Justice Statistics, Interpol, the United Nations, Sprint, as well as law enforcement institutions from around the world. In the past year, along with another principal investigator, I received over two-million dollars in competitive grant funding from the National Institute of Justice and Bureau of Justice Assistance. These grants fund an extensive research operation focused on cutting-edge cyber and digital investigations and builds protocols for law enforcement and government agencies to follow to obtain evidence and prosecute crimes. We are also funded to take the findings of our work and build online classes to support state, local and tribal law enforcement.

In addition to my work in cyber investigations, I am a practicing Attorney and Counselor-at-Law in New York and co-chair of the New York City Bar Association's Technology, Privacy and Cyber Committee. My legal practice has included the representation of non-profit corporations and I am intimately familiar with common compliance and legal issues of concern to New York non-profits corporations. In addition, at John Jay College, I created and teach a graduate course on New York State non-profits corporations.

If I am fortunate to be elected to the Association Board, I hope to build upon my prior involvement and further the mission and goals of the Association of Inspectors General.
