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Biography: Leigh R. Anderson, Ph.D., MPA-IG, CIGA, CIGE

Originally from Saint Louis, Missouri, Dr. Leigh R. Anderson graduated, summa cum laude, phi beta kappa, from Howard University with two Bachelors of Arts Degrees in Administration of Justice and Spanish. She went on to graduate from John Jay College of Criminal Justice's Masters of Public Administration-Inspector General Program, and then successfully obtained a Ph.D. in Public Policy and Management from the John Glenn College at The Ohio State University. By way of certifications, Dr. Leigh R. Anderson is a Certified Inspector General Auditor (CIGA), a Certified Inspector General Inspector/Evaluator (CIGE), both through the Association of Inspectors General, and a Certified Homicide Investigator through the North East Multi-Regional Training® Police Training Institute.

In addition to being certified, Dr. Anderson is an instructor for the Association of Inspectors General - Inspector General Institute® Certified Inspector/Evaluator Course, certified by the National Association of State Boards of Accountancy (NASBA). In her capacity with the Association of Inspectors General, she also serves as a member of the Peer Review Team - The Association of Inspectors General (AIG) 'encourages professional development; standardizing practices, policies, and ethics; and establishing professional qualifications, and certifications of Offices of Inspectors General (OIG).' The AIG peer review program assesses AIG member organizations in their efforts to comply with statutes, local ordinances, charters, etc., further fortifying Dr. Anderson's overall interest in executing and ensuring proper oversight in the public sector.

Dr. Anderson currently serves as the Executive Director of the Police Accountability Team for the City of Cleveland, Ohio. She came to Cleveland as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Criminal Justice Studies at Southern Illinois University and a Contractual Chief of Staff for the City of Oakland Office of the Inspector General under the City's Police Commission. Previously, Dr. Anderson served as a Chief Performance Analyst in the Public Safety Section of the City of Chicago Office of Inspector General where she led and conducted audits and evaluations of the Chicago Police Department (CPD), the Civilian Office of Police Accountability (COPA), and the Police Board (PB) to increase public safety, protect civil liberties, and increase the public's confidence in the City of Chicago public safety structure. She was also a Performance Analyst with the District of Columbia Office of Inspector General.

In February 2025, she was a guest speaker, along with the Chief of Police, for an endowed program at the City Club of Cleveland to discuss progress and challenges associated with achieving compliance with Consent Decrees. The forum laid at the nexus of their Politics, Public Policy, and Criminal Justice series.

Dr. Anderson was humbled to be named one of Crain's Notable Black Leaders for 2024. In 2024, she was also named to be one of the inaugural recipients of the 'Engage! Cleveland' 24 in 24 Award, an honor bestowed upon the city's most accomplished 24 emerging professionals. In 2023, she was recognized as a recipient of the 40 under 40 award in Northeast Ohio by Crain's Cleveland Business. Dr. Anderson is also honored to have been profiled as an Alumna of the Doctoral Program in Public Policy from the John Glenn College of Public Affairs at The Ohio State University. The Glenn College is the number one ranked public affairs school in the State of Ohio and the number 16th ranked Public Affairs College out of 271 schools in the nation. In October of 2021, Dr. Anderson was awarded the Distinguished Young Alumni Achievement Award which recognizes alumni who have demonstrated early distinctive achievement in their public service careers.

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Steven D. Anderson, CIG

Candidate for Board of Directors, Association of Inspectors General

Steven Anderson is a Certified Inspector General and has served as the Kansas Inspector General since April 2021. Since becoming Inspector General, Mr. Anderson has successfully expanded his office's authority and increased staffing. His office started with three staff members, including himself, and only had oversight of Kansas Medicaid programs with no investigative capability and/or function. Currently, Mr. Anderson's office has 22 staff members and the statutory authority to oversee and conduct audits, performance reviews, and investigations of the Kansas cash, food, and health assistance programs, to increase accountability, integrity, and oversight of these programs.

Mr. Anderson has also provided numerous trainings and informational presentations on interviewing, report writing, fraud awareness, identity theft, and ethics. He has provided presentations at national training conferences and receives frequent requests for his expertise on interviewing and conducting investigations of elder abuse, neglect, and exploitation.

His law enforcement experience includes over five years as the Special Agent in Charge (SAC) with the Kansas Attorney General's Medicaid Fraud & Abuse Division and over 25 years in Federal law enforcement. He served as the SAC of the U.S. Department of Labor, Office of Labor Racketeering and Fraud Investigations, Office of Inspector General (OIG), and as the SAC with the U.S. Department of Education, OIG. He also held Special Agent positions with the General Services Administration, OIG, and the U.S. Air Force, Office of Special Investigations. He has a Bachelor of Science in Management of Human Resources from Park University and an Associate Degree in Criminal Justice.

During his federal career, Mr. Anderson supervised the peer reviews of two other OIGs for Investigations in 2014 and 2015. Under his leadership, the reviews were conducted in conformity with the Quality Standards for Investigations guidelines established by the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency (CIGIE). The team reviewed the system of internal safeguards and management procedures for the investigative function of the other agencies and provided comprehensive reports of their observations to the appropriate officials.

Additionally, Mr. Anderson is currently the Treasurer for the Western States Chapter of the Association of Inspectors General.

Dr. Glenda B. Arrington, Inspector General and Senior Executive (Retired), brings extensive experience across the public and private sectors, academia, community outreach, and nonprofit board leadership. Her federal government career spanned more than 41 years in the Executive and Legislative Branches, where she served as an Inspector General, Deputy Inspector General, Investigator, Auditor, Inspector, and Evaluator. Dr. Arrington served as the Inspector General in California, Virginia, Maryland, and the District of Columbia.

Dr. Arrington is an active member of AIG and previously served on the AIG Board for approximately 10 years, supporting governmental integrity and efficiency. Over that time, she conducts Peer Reviews to ensure federal, state, and local Inspector General offices maintain self-regulation to comply with applicable standards and regulations.

Dr. Arrington was selected for the inaugural class of Certified Inspectors and Evaluators (CIGE) and developed the first CIGE course. Since then, she has served as the CIGE Course Manager, ensuring students receive training that meets the standards of the Association of Inspectors General requirements.

Dr. Arrington is certified by the Association of Inspectors General as a Certified Inspector General, and Certified Inspector and Evaluator. She is also certified by the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners as a Certified Fraud Examiner. In addition, she holds certification as an Enterprise Risk Manager and Federal Law Enforcement Training Center.

Dr. Arrington is a graduate of the Harvard Kennedy School of Government, the Federal Executive Institute, Northwestern University Kellogg Executive Education, the Office of Personnel Management Senior Executive Assessment Program, and the Navy Corporate Business program at the Naval Postgraduate School. Claudette Biemeret Biographical Sketch

Claudette Biemeret serves as the Inspector General for the San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit District (BART), where she leads an independent office responsible for conducting performance audits and investigations of fraud, waste, abuse, and other improper governmental activities. She brings 18 years of independent public-sector oversight experience and is a Certified Inspector General®.

Appointed Inspector General by the Governor of California in 2023, she previously served as BART's first Deputy Inspector General and held progressively responsible positions with the City of Berkeley Auditor's Office, advancing from Auditor to Audit Manager.

As Inspector General, Claudette oversees a multidisciplinary program of audits, investigations, recommendation follow-up, quality assurance, strategic planning, and public reporting. She has led oversight work involving major capital projects, contracting, overtime, inventory and purchasing, workers' compensation, infrastructure reliability, organizational management, and internal controls.

Claudette has also worked to strengthen the BART OIG's independence and authority and ensure that the office's oversight work meets professional standards, including the AIG's Principles and Standards for Offices of Inspector General. Her experience navigating difficult governance issues, organizational resistance, competing stakeholder interests, and highly visible public matters would allow her to bring a practical, independent, and candid perspective to the AIG Board.

Claudette currently serves as President of the AIG Western States Chapter and as a member of the AIG Membership Committee's Policy and Dues Subcommittee. As Chapter President, she has focused on professional development, increased member engagement, and meaningful value for Chapter members. She has also presented at the AIG conference and supported professional certification, training, and collaboration among oversight professionals. Through the subcommittee, she helped develop and advance AIG's new membership model, an initiative designed to simplify the organization's membership structure, strengthen national and chapter alignment, expand member benefits, reduce administrative complexity, and support AIG's long-term financial sustainability.

Claudette would bring to the AIG Board the perspective of a working inspector general, 18 years of independent oversight experience, and direct involvement in shaping AIG's future. Her priorities would include supporting inspectors general and oversight offices of all sizes, expanding accessible training and professional resources, promoting rigorous and relevant standards, strengthening communication among AIG's national organization, chapters, and members, and ensuring that AIG remains a credible and influential voice for independent public-sector oversight.

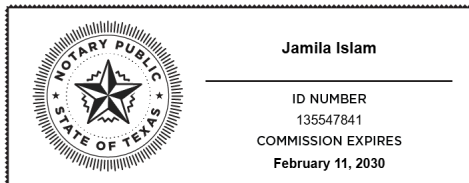

Sworn Biographical Sketch of Brigitte Bishop , CIG

For more than 30 years, I have dedicated my career to public service, oversight, and law enforcement. I began my career as a prosecutor in Canada, specializing in the prosecution of drug trafficking, money laundering and organized crime. I hold a law degree; a master's in financial crime and most recently earned a Certificate in Mediation from the Faculty of Law at the Université de Sherbrooke.

I joined the Association of Inspectors General in 2017 as an Assistant Inspector General and became a Certified Inspector General in 2018. Shortly after, I was appointed Inspector General for the City of Montreal for a non-renewable term of 5 years and served for 7 years. Since joining the AIG, I have been an active participant in our organization, regularly attending and presenting at the Annual Training Conference to learn, share knowledge and strengthen our profession.

Serving on the AIG board of Directors since 2020 has been one the greatest honors. During my tenure, I have proudly contributed to several key committees, including the Annual Training Committee for the Washington edition, the Membership Committee, Investment Committee, Election Committee, and the Executive Committee. I have also been actively engaged in defending the independence of the inspector general profession, including supporting our colleagues in Louisiana during critical challenges to their independence.

Today, I serve as Director of Québec's Bureau des enquêtes indépendantes (Independent Investigation Bureau), a law enforcement agency responsible for conducting criminal investigations involving police officers in the performance of their duties, particularly incidents involving the use of force. This role has reinforced my commitment to accountability, integrity, and public trust.

Being an Inspector General can often be a lonely responsibility. We are asked to make difficult decisions, uphold the highest ethical standards, and remain independent in the face of significant challenges. That is why I believe the AIG plays such a vital role – not only as a professional association but as a community.

If re-elected to the Board of Directors, I will continue working to ensure that every member feels heard, respected and supported. I want every Inspector General to know that they are not alone, that their work matters, and that the AIG is a place where they can find guidance, professional excellence, and a network of colleagues who understand the unique challenges of our profession.

LaDawn Blackett, Inspector General – City of Atlanta
Biographical Sketch

LaDawn Blackett, Interim Inspector General for the City of Atlanta since March 2025, is a seasoned legal professional and public servant whose multifaceted career uniquely positions her to serve on the Board of Directors for the Association of Inspectors General.

Her early legal career was in the Fulton County District Attorney's Office (2005–2010). As Chief Senior Assistant District Attorney, she directed the Community Prosecution Unit and spearheaded a multi-jurisdictional Burglary Task Force, achieving significant crime reductions. She also authored the foundational 150-page manual guiding new prosecutors—a testament to her leadership and commitment to institutional excellence. During her tenure as Director of the Community Prosecution Unit, LaDawn expanded the division from three district offices to seven, ensuring complete coverage throughout the county.

In 2013, Blackett transitioned to elected office as the State Representative for Georgia's 62nd District (2013–2017). During her tenure she sat on the Judiciary and Fiscal Oversight committees, championing municipal legislation, and co-sponsoring landmark reforms such as the creation of the City of South Fulton. Awarded as a "Champion of Cities" by the Georgia Municipal Association, Blackett often worked across the aisle and sponsored passing legislation that assisted the entire state.

Her adeptness in policy-making and governance continued with her leading role as South Fulton's first Solicitor General (2018–2021). In this role Blackett drafted the entire criminal code for the newly created city and established court infrastructure, streamlined operations, and managed hundreds of cases. Later she worked as the Interim Court Administrator for both City of South Fulton and the City of Clarkston ensuring smooth processes and good customer service. During her tenure as Interim Court Administrator, she created a virtual court process from the ground up, cleared a COVID-impacted backlog, and managed departmental budgets.

Parallel to her public roles, she built The LBJ Law Group, focusing on criminal defense, intellectual property, and family law. LaDawn has authored four books and co-executive produced a documentary based on her non-fiction work that highlighted a criminal case that made national headlines. In her private life, outside of being a mother, she has mentored over 200 girls from her community since 2005.

In March 2025, Mayor Andre Dickens appointed Judge Blackett Interim Inspector General for the City of Atlanta. In her short time as Inspector General, she has used her nearly two decades in law to improve the OIG's independent audits, investigations, and compliance reviews, introducing anti-fraud programs and reinforcing ethical governance. She concurrently serves as a Judge in the South Fulton Municipal Court and Dekalb County State Court, presiding over misdemeanor and traffic offenses while underscoring judicial fairness.

Her extensive resume—spanning prosecution, politics, criminal defense, adjudication, legislation, administration, and inspector general functions—demonstrates deep expertise in accountability, legal integrity, and institutional leadership. This comprehensive skill set, coupled with her track record of creating and overseeing ethical, efficient systems, makes LaDawn Blackett exceptionally well-qualified for a leadership role on the Association of Inspectors General's Board.

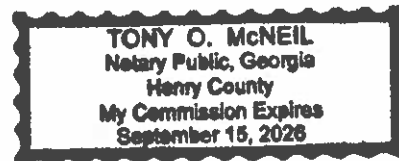

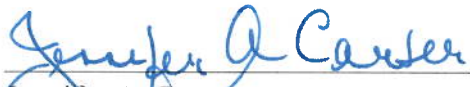

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH FOR JENNIFER CARTER

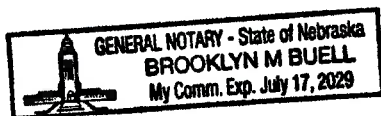
Jennifer Carter serves as the Inspector General of Nebraska Child Welfare. She was appointed to the role in September 2020 and has been a Certified Inspector General through the Association of Inspectors General since 2022. The Office of Inspector General of Nebraska Child Welfare (OIG-CW) provides legislative oversight and accountability for the child welfare and juvenile justice systems through system monitoring and review, mandatory investigations of child deaths and serious injuries, and recommendations for system improvement. The OIG-CW is housed within the legislative branch in the Nebraska Legislature's Division of Legislative Oversight.

Ms. Carter received her undergraduate degree from Columbia University and her juris doctorate from Boston University School of Law. Following law school, Ms. Carter worked at the law firms of Cravath, Swaine & Moore and Sidley & Austin in New York. She also served as law clerk to the Honorable Lawrence L. Piersol, Chief Judge for the U.S. District of South Dakota. In 2003, Ms. Carter moved to Nebraska and began her public interest career, spending 11 years at a policy and legal advocacy non-profit, Nebraska Appleseed, where she held various titles and roles, including staff attorney, Director of the Child Welfare and Health Care Programs, and Director of Public Policy. In addition to litigation, consulting, and lobbying experience, Ms. Carter also served as legal counsel to the Health and Human Services Committee of the Nebraska Legislature prior to being appointed IG.

Ms. Carter currently serves on the Government Affairs Committee for the AIG. She has also served on the Board of Directors for several non-profits in Nebraska.

Massachusetts Inspector General 1991-2001. The Massachusetts Inspector General was the first statewide Inspector General position created in the U.S. and the first Inspector General position created outside of the federal system. The OIG survived and is growing strong.

New Orleans Inspector General 2007-2009. Created in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, the New Orleans Office of the Inspector General was based on the principles and guidance outlined in the Green Book. As the first New Orleans Inspector General, Cerasoli built the office from the ground up, securing funding, re-writing the city ordinance, creating a police monitor to investigate the police, and co-authoring a state law to strengthen the office. He also advocated for a ballot question to embed the office in the City Charter by a vote of the people. The Charter Amendment that was adopted included the unique concept of a guaranteed revenue stream for the Office of Inspector General of three quarters of one percent (0.75%) of the city operating budget. The OIG survived is growing strong.

This book was used as a basis for the creation of the Inspector General office in New Orleans.

He is semi-retired and currently serves as the Executive Director of the South Shore Workforce Development Board in Quincy, Massachusetts.

Kim Raines Chatelain, Inspector General Jefferson Parish Government, Louisiana

Kim Raines Chatelain has served as Inspector General for the Jefferson Parish Office of Inspector General (JPOIG) since March 2022. She previously served as the Office's First Assistant Inspector General from its establishment in September 2013, helping build the office from inception.

Ms. Chatelain joined the Association of Inspectors General (AIG) in 2013 and attended her first Annual Training Conference in New Orleans that same year. She became Certified Inspector General (CIG) in 2014 and, in 2019, participated in the pilot program that launched the Certified Inspector General Inspector/Evaluator (CIGE) certification, becoming one of the program's first certificate holders.

First elected to the AIG Board of Directors for the 2018–2020 term, Ms. Chatelain has continued to serve on the Board, serving on the Executive Committee and presently serving as Second Vice President. She chairs both the Training Committee and the Professional Certification Board, where she supports and guides the Association's annual training conference and certification programs. Since 2020, she has served as an instructor for the AIG Training Institutes, teaching courses on ethics, history, and professional standards.

A licensed attorney with more than 33 years of legal experience, Ms. Chatelain served for 14 years as an Assistant Attorney General for the State of Louisiana, representing governmental entities in state and federal courts and advising on legislative, administrative, and regulatory matters. Before joining the JPOIG, she served as Jefferson Parish's first Director of Governmental and Ethics Compliance, where she developed government-wide administrative policies and established Parish's ethics education program.

Ms. Chatelain earned her Juris Doctor from Tulane University Law School and her Bachelor of Arts from Louisiana State University. She is a Certified Inspector General (CIG) and Certified Inspector General Inspector/Evaluator by the Association, a Certified Ethics and Compliance Professional (CCEP) by the Society of Corporate Compliance & Ethics Professionals (SCCE), and a Certified Fraud Examiner (CFE) by the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners (ACFE).
